GUIDELINE STATEMENT:

- A. When the Interventional Radiology (IR) Registered Nurse (RN) identifies a patient issue that requires the input and/or assistance of a Physician/Provider, it will be the responsibility of the RN to contact the appropriate Physician and/or Provider.
 - I. Physician/Provider is defined as any Nurse Practitioner, Physician Assistant, Physician, Resident, Fellow, Attending Physician, or Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist (CRNA)
- B. In cases where any type of anesthesia has been administered, or care has been provided by an Anesthesia Physician/Provider, the Anesthesia Physician/Provider will be contacted first.
- C. The clinical situation will define the timeliness of the response.

RESPONSIBLE PARTY:

Interventional Radiology Registered Nurse and/or Interventional Radiology Tech

GENERAL GUIDELINES:

- A. When a patient issue is identified requiring the input and/or assistance of a Physician or Provider in the IR department, the following Chain of Command should be used:
 - Procedural Resident or Advanced Practice Provider (APP)
 - Attending Provider
 - Anesthesia Resident or CRNA (if applicable)
 - CRNA for minor non-life-threatening problems. If the problem is life threatening problem, go immediately to the Attending Anesthesiologist. Attending Anesthesiologist (If applicable)
- B. In addition to notifying the correct Physician/Provider, the Charge Nurse should be informed of any patient issues that require immediate input and/or assistance.
 - Charge Nurse to escalate concern to management
